

# **Imprtant Information**

Your booking has been placed in uor reservation system and will remain as provisional until the deposit has been received. Deposit cheques can be mailed to the booking secretary at the address below and a confirmation will be sent to you when received.

All bookings remain provisional until the deposit has been received and the dates will remain open to other groups.

#### What to Bring

Camp Woodlands is a backcountry campground with limited facilities. There are several structures on site that provide shelter and sanitation. All cooking materials, fuel and supplies (including water) must be brought in. Campers will require everything they might take on a backcountry camping adventure.

A full list of supplies is listed on our Facilities web page and can be used for reference. The water in the lake is great for swimming but must be boiled for an appropriate amount of time before it can be used as potable water.

## Check-In

Camp Woodlands is located in a farily remote location and we do not check in campers. We will ensure that the access gates are unlocked and open upon your arrival. Please do not arrive before your stated check-in time as these gates may be locked.

#### Departure

When you have finished your camp, please make sure to take all garbage with you and leave the facilities as you find them. We will send you an invoice at the end of your booking and payment can be sent to the Booking Secretary when received.

### **Camp Rules**

Camp Woodlands is a rural proeprty but we do have neighbours across the lake and sound travels easily. PLease make sure that quiet time is no later than 11pm and noise is minimal until 7am.

Please use any fallen wood you find locally, but please do not cut trees or vegetation from around the site. No large fires or burning of plastics.

Please treat our campground with care, we hope campers will refrain from climbing on the buildings and structures and damaging the facilities.

Only put compostable (toilet paper) waste in the pit toilets.

Leave the camp as you find it - please take all garbage with you as we have wildlife in the area and no garbage disposal.

Please make sure to use the wood stoves or fire rings provided. No fires are to be left unattended.

Please do not park vehicles in areas that are seeded, vehicles should remain on the gravel.

Please store food in secure containers or in the kitchen in an appropriate place, we have bears and other animals locally.
